

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

### Monitoring Requirements Not Met for GA2990019 WAYCROSS-WARE COUNTY IND. PARK

***\*We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the compliance period of 1/1/2010 to 12/31/2012, we did not complete all monitoring or testing for LEAD & COPPER and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.\****

**What should you do?** There is nothing you need to do at this time. Routine monitoring is beginning again in August 2013.

The table below gives more detailed information about this monitoring violation:

What is being done? (Corrective action)

There is no corrective action required at this time. This notice is required due to a processing/sample collection error that resulted in only 5 samples being collected instead of the required 10 based on system population. The quality of our drinking water samples that have been tested since the beginning of this program for Lead & Copper have all been in compliance and the system is on “**reduced monitoring**” with all samples being well within all safe drinking water requirements. Current routine monitoring is commencing in August 2013. Please feel free to contact our office, we will be happy to answer any questions you may have.
