1901 City Boulevard sewer repair easement issue is on hold. Music has provided a schedule for completion of the additional parking improvements. Continue to monitor to be sure it is completed.

Guardrail at the canal crossings on Dorothy and Blackwell estimate is complete. Action item is to get the info to the Commission agenda on a date approved by the City Manager for approval prior to going out for public bid.

Monitor the rehab of the Central Park Apartments drainage system. North access has failed additionally. Chief Eddings has provided a letter to the owner recommending removal of all tenants impacted by the failure. Owner has agreed to immediately repair the failure to provide safe access for the tenants and public safety needs. Contractor has made repairs, but additional work is necessary to complete. It appears the storm may have caused some settling. It is fire truck accessible for now.



Set up meeting with the Board of Education to discuss the stormwater utility fee reduction request. Coordinate with City Manager.

Carswell Drainage improvements need to be added to the Commission agenda as approved by the City Manager. Thrift Brothers, LLC and Underground Excavating will pick up plans for outside quotes furnishing everything but pipe.


